Camporee Information and Guidelines

1. **Registration:** Your unit is registered when you have paid your fees by using the provided Registration Form in the Leader's Guide. You need to complete a Camporee Unit Roster (also provided), BSA Local Tour Permit (file the Local Tour Permit with Council and bring a copy to camporee), and keep with you a copy of each person's **Health History Form** currently found on the back of the BSA individual applications or any current BSA medical form.
2. **Registration fees are \$12.00 for each per Scout and Scouter. EARLY REGISTRATION FEES ARE DISCOUNTED TO \$10.00 and will be accepted at the February, March, and April Roundtables. Fees and registration must be turned in at Roundtables for the DISCOUNT FEE. All other Registrations will be at sign in on Friday May 1, 2009, at Camporee headquarters at the FULL FEE OF \$12.00.**
3. **Fees and all registration forms must be completed and presented at the time of registration before your unit will be assigned or allowed to enter a campsite.** Registered units will be given their campsite assignments at the gate upon arrival. All units (Cub or Boy Scout) that did not register at Roundtable must come to the Dining Hall and complete registration before being assigned a campsite. All registration forms must be completed and turned in by 11:00 PM Friday May 1, 2009.
4. **FEES ARE NON-REFUNDABLE.**
5. **Campsites:** Troops and Packs will **NOT** be camping in the same site. Units will be assigned to campsites by the camporee facilities staff.
6. **Check-In will begin at 4:00 PM on Friday, May 1, 2009. Absolutely no one will enter earlier! This is to allow the camporee staff to have all areas set-up, prepared, and ready for unit arrival in a safe and efficient manner.**
 - a. Upon arrival on Friday, pre-registered units will be directed to their campsites. **All drivers must know what unit they belong to!!**
 - b. Please have someone from your unit return to the Dining Hall to complete the registration and arrival process. **ONLY ONE!**
 - c. Unit trailers and one vehicle per Troop or Pack may be left in camp. **ALL OTHER** vehicles will be out of the campsites and parked in the appropriate parking lots by 11:00 PM. Drivers will be told which parking area to use when they arrive at the Camp Durant main entrance.
7. **Quiet Hours:** Everyone must be in their respective campsites between the hours of **11:00 PM and 6:00 AM**. All are expected to be quiet. "*A Scout is Courteous*". **This is each unit leader's responsibility.**

- 8. Health and Safety:** All safety precautions will be adhered to throughout the camporee. Report all unsafe conditions and actions to a staff member (list on page 3) or Executive staff member immediately. If the action is unsafe, stop the action IMMEDIATELY then report.

EMERGENCY Protocol: In the event of an emergency, ie: lost child or missing person, fire, etc, there will be a series of three (3) blasts of horn. At that point ALL persons, Scouts and non-Scouts will report to the flag pole on the vista at the Dining Hall. There will be NO EXCEPTIONS! For everyone's safety, remain at the Dining Hall for further instruction.

- 9. First Aid:** Scout leaders are to be prepared to handle all minor situations. Each unit is to have a First Aid Kit in their campsite. Serious injuries and emergencies must be reported immediately to the Camporee Headquarters (Dining Hall). There will be a trained Medical Technician present on site during the entire Camporee. Units having additional trained medical personnel present are asked to notify our Health and Safety Chairperson. The nearest full service hospital is Moore Regional Hospital in Pinehurst, NC.
- 10. Campfires:** Digging of fire pits is prohibited. Use ground fires only, and only in designated fire lay locations. (if camporee staff permits). Under no circumstances will any tree be cut down. Use extreme caution with all fires. Keep all fires at a reasonable size; never leave a fire unattended and always provide adult supervision for all fires. Each unit must bring it's own fire extinguishers and fire control equipment. **All units need to plan for camp stove cooking or no-heat meals in the event there is a ban on campfires. Use camp stoves properly. This also applies to Cub Scouts and Family Campers. NOTE: Use of liquid fire starters is prohibited within the Boy Scouts of America.**
- 11. Chemical Fuels:** Use of liquid fuel, propane, and butane in stoves and lanterns is permitted only with knowledgeable adult supervision.
- 12. Campsite Inspection:** Campsites will be inspected. A member from each campsite will assist a campsite inspection team. Each Troop and Pack will be inspected and checked separately.
- 13. Water:** Water is available at the Campsites. **Units will need to provide their own water containers.** Scouts should carry their own canteens or water bottles during all activities. Each unit should bring a water hose to help with clean-up.
- 14. Uniforms:** Field uniforms are to be worn during Campfire, and the Scout's Own Service. Activity uniforms are to be worn at all other times. **Camouflage Clothing is not permitted** at any time for Scouts or Scouters.

- 15. Trading Post:** The Trading Posts are open Friday 6:00 PM to 10:00PM. And on Saturday, 9:00 AM to 5:00 PM and 9:00 PM to 10:00 PM.
- 16. Visitors:** Visitors are welcome. They may observe all events, activities, visit unit campsites, and attend the Camporee Campfire. All visitors must leave the Camporee by 11:00 PM each night. All persons who stay overnight must be registered with a unit or Family Camping and pay Camporee fees. All visitors must check in at Camporee Headquarters - Dining Hall.
- 17. Campfire Program:** Saturday evening: Each unit will draw a number during the registration sign-in on Friday; this number will correlate to a song, skit, cheer or nothing. Some event recognitions will be made at the Saturday campfire. The Friday evening campfire is optional, and is a sing-along style event.
- 18. Worship Service:** *A Scout is reverent.* An interfaith Scout's Own service will be held on Sunday morning at the Flagpole at 8:30 AM. There will be no movement of vehicles in camp until after the service is completed.
- 19. Check-Out:** Check-out forms and procedures will be given upon arrival. **There will be NO CHECKOUTS during camporee activities, ie campfire programs or assemblies.**
- 20. Trash/Garbage:** BE PREPARED for all non-burnable garbage and trash to be carried out upon departure. Dumpsters may be available. Ensure that all trash is in the dumpster - NOT piled on top. If dumpsters are FULL – CARRY IT OUT!
- 21. Alternate Plans:** No plans have been made for rescheduling the camporee. In case of extreme weather or major emergency, the Camporee Chief or the Professional Staff may cancel the camporee. If the camporee is cancelled, the Scout shop will be notified. The local radio stations (Q98 & WKML) will also be notified. The County Sheriff or Professional Advisor will notify the Camporee Chief to start evacuation procedures (if needed) during the camporee itself.
- 22. Camporee T-shirts must be pre-ordered through Camporee Registrar. **Deadline for ordering T-Shirts is April Roundtable. NO EXCEPTIONS!****
- 23.** If there are more than 2 units per campsite, the units are expected to share shelters and other facilities and to clean them up together.
- 24. PROHIBITED ITEMS:** Fireworks, firearms (of any type), sheath knives, illegal drugs, and alcoholic beverages. Youth are NOT to carry communication or radio devices. Frequencies will be assigned at check in for units requiring radio communication. Anyone bringing prohibited items will be required to leave with forfeiture of all fees paid. (Also refer to Guide to Safe Scouting.)

- 25. Absolutely no pets are allowed. This includes visitors.** Disability Service Dogs are permitted.
- 26. RULE VIOLATIONS: The Camporee Chief or Scoutmaster, in consultation with the Camporee Staff, will determine penalties for any violation of the rules.**
- 27. Lost and Found:** Lost and Found items are to be turned in to Headquarters (Dining Hall). These items will be displayed at Flag Raising/Flag lowering and assemblies.
- 28.** The summer camp staff will be taking part in their training during the weekend of our camporee. **DO NOT INTERFERE WITH THE STAFF TRAINING.** If a conflict arises between the camporee and the staff training, the primary camporee staff members will coordinate a solution with the staff director.
- 29.** The Ocooneechee Scout Reservation has a Campmaster program in effect across the reservation. If the on-duty Campmaster directs you to take or stop an action or activity, comply with his direction and make a report to the camporee staff.

BOY SCOUT PROGRAM NOTES

TERMINOLOGY: Survivor Durant requires special effort of all involved to utilize skills learned throughout the year. Special skills may be required during the weekend event. This will include use of special terminology possibly unfamiliar to participants.

EVENT PREPARATION:

Tribes and Clans are strongly encouraged to review the current Boy Scout handbook, Fieldbook, and various merit badge pamphlets to hone their individual and Tribal or Clan skills.

Tribes and Clans will not know in advance what the specific events are. This is owing to the nature of the survival style reality event. Those familiar with the television series Survivor or The Great Race will be familiar with this event style. The following information is meant to help each Tribe and Clan to prepare for these unknown events.

Clans may use only the material and resources described for each event. All Clans and their Survivors should Be Prepared with resources mentioned in the Boy Scout handbook for individuals and in the camporee leader's guide (below). Clans are expected to provide any resources mentioned in the leader's guide.

Some events may involve Tribal Elders. Elders are not required to be listed on the Clan roster, but must be with the Clan in order for the selected event to proceed. Elders known as parents (not registered BSA adults) are allowed to participate as needed, but must be registered as camporee participants and listed on the Tribal Elder roster. Tribes will be

advised on which events Elders may participate in either at the Friday Chief's Council or at the Saturday morning or afternoon Assembly of Nations.

KUDU HORN: The Tribe determined to have the highest Clan participation level, Scout Spirit, and ability to Prepare, Think, and Do as part of Teamwork will take home the prized Kudu Horn. Selected events will be used to determine the Kudu Horn competition. Tribes and Clans will not know which events are used for the Kudu Horn – the main factor here is BE PREPARED to DO YOUR BEST in *all events* during the camporee.

Event Chief: Each event or wide game will have a designated Event Chief. This may be an adult or older Scout. The Event Chief will describe the event rules, purpose, and scoring to each Clan. The Event Chief will make the final decision on scoring for each event.

SCORING: Clans will be scored on each event in a consistent manner throughout the camporee. Clans will know at the end of each event how well they performed. However, FUN, PARTICIPATION and SCOUT SPIRIT are the main factors in determining how well the Clan performs *overall*. Also, the presence of a Clan Spirit Stick is considered part of the participation, and Clan “noise” is considered part of Scout Spirit.

Gateways: Boy Scout unit gateways should incorporate the theme *Survivor Durant* and be a temporary style survival shelter. Marked entrance ways to each campsite with materials provided by Camporee Staff and found at Camp Durant. Units may not bring materials with them. Construction of gateways will be included in Kudu Horn competition. See the *Wilderness Survival* merit badge pamphlet for ideas.

Needed Equipment: Each patrol MUST carry the following items to each event on Saturday.

A. Each **CLAN** must have:

1. Spirit Stick and “noise”
2. Scout Handbook
3. Pocketknife (persons carrying must have Tote-n-Chit)
4. First Aid kit
5. Matches, Fire starter **or** trail stove with fuel
 - a. Commercial fire starters are **NOT** approved.
 - b. Chemical material other than fuel for trail stoves is **NOT** approved.
6. Compass
7. Method to purify drinking water on the trail (heat / filter / tablets / etc)
8. Notebook & Pen or Pencil
9. 25 feet Nylon Cord minimum. 50 feet recommended
10. Trail food or snacks.

B. Each **SURVIVOR** must have:

1. Water bottle or canteen, with fresh drinking water
2. Rain gear

3. Sun protection

C. **Tribal** Equipment:

For the Gateway Competition: Each Troop should have sufficient supply of rope or 550 cord which may used to construct a safe and functional survival style gateway.

Iron Chef Dutch Oven cooking event:

1. Two Dutch ovens
2. Mixing Bowls
3. Cutting and cooking utensils
4. Cutting Board
5. Spices and Seasoning
6. Matches or lighter
7. Display Plates or Bowls for 3 judges

Directions to Camp Durant

From Spring Lake go north toward Sanford on NC 24/87

At Spout Springs, exit NC 87 to the right and go west on NC 24 through Cameron and to Carthage. In the event road construction on NC 24/87 has the NC 24 exit closed, continue north to the NC 27 exit. At the end of the exit ramp, turn left and take NC 27 to NC 24. Turn right on NC 24/27

Go through Carthage on NC 24 using the traffic circle around the old county courthouse. About 1.2 miles beyond the old courthouse, turn left on to Bethlehem Church Road. At the intersection of NC 24 and Bethlehem Church Road, there is a sign on the right side of the road showing the turn to "Occoneechee Scout Camps". An old-style gas station sits in the "Y" of the intersection.

Continue on Bethlehem Church Road. After passing the first traffic light, Camp Durant is about 1/4 mile on the left.

LOOK FOR "KIA KIMA" DIRECTION SIGNS BOTH ON ROAD AND OFF -- THERE ARE OTHER DISTRICT CAMPOREES AT CAMP DURING THIS TIME.

IRON CHEF RULES

The Iron Chef competition will be similar to the one on the Food Network show, with a twist. Our Iron Chef will be done with Dutch Ovens only.

Each Troop will have a Team of 2 Scouts (**no Adults allowed in cooking area**). You will be given 3 hours to complete 2 dishes; a main dish and a dessert. Both dishes will incorporate the “secret ingredient”. Each Team will be allowed to bring:

- 3 vegetables
- 1 meat
- 1 fruit
- 1 garnish (Garnish is to be used during plating only. It may not be incorporated into the dish.)
- Seasonings and spices (If you bring a fruit or vegetable as a seasoning, it will be counted as a fruit or vegetable.) **No pre-prepared sauces or dressings are allowed!**
- Flours
- Sugars
- Vegetable oil

All teams are to assemble in front of the old dining hall at 1:30 pm for instructions. All cooking equipment and food must be with you at that time. You will register your team **and your ingredients** before the “secret ingredient” will be handed out. Please, follow the approved list of ingredients. Iron chef registrar and judges have the right to disallow the use of an ingredient if it doesn't meet the approved list. Cooking will take place in the designated area. Competition will start at 2pm and finish at 5 pm. You will plate your food and get it to the judging area by 5:00pm. The following items will be provided to each team:

- Water
- Serving dishes
- Charcoal and newspaper (The Scouts will be expected to start their own charcoal using a chimney.)
- Metal charcoal pans. However, if you have a Dutch Oven table and would like to use it for your cooking, that would be acceptable.

There will be a panel of 3 judges. Each judge can award up to 20 points per entry. Every team could get as much as 60 points for this event. The team of Scouts from each unit will be accepted to tell the judges how they incorporated the secret ingredient into both of their dishes.

10 points for best use of “secret ingredient”

5 points for presentation

5 points for taste

There are a few things that we don't want to see.

- Any kitchen tools that you would not normally use at a regular campout.
- Cookbooks
- Drinks with the dishes
