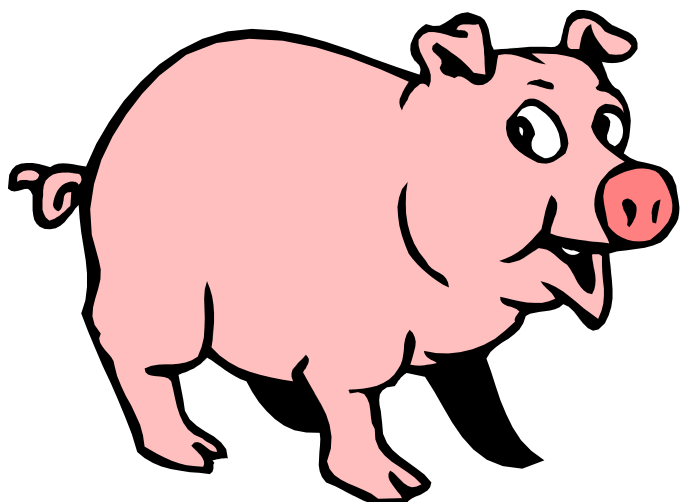

- For health reasons Kay Stewart has reduced her Scouting activities by resigning as District Advancement Chairman. We're very appreciative of her contributions to the Scouts and Scouters of the district. Let us keep her in our thoughts and prayers.

- Pack leaders, please submit your Unit Advancement Reports as soon as your Cub Scouts complete their advancements. This is especially important with Webelos IIs when they complete Arrow of Light as the "computer" has a history of not accepting the Cub Scout's rank after he has "bridged" and joined a troop.
- Merit Badge Counselors: This is a Council position, not a unit one, and registration is based on the calendar year. Counselors registered in 2011 will be automatically registered in 2012 as long as their Youth Protection Training is current. Other wise they will not be reregistered.
- Scoutmasters: The 2012 *Boy Scout Requirements* book is now available at the Cumberland Scout Shop. The Council's 2012 *Life to Eagle Guide* is under development due to recent changes in the *Eagle Scout Leadership Service Project Workbook*.
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- All leaders: With the expiration of the 2011 Gold Card at the end of February, Council has made an unwanted budgetary decision. Effective March 1st, Council will no longer provide Scouts with a "free" initial rank badge. With the exception of the Eagle Scout presentation kit, units will have to buy all rank badges. For some units this may require a budget revision.

Guidelines and Regulations for Campout

- **Advance registration is required.** Payment is due at the time of registration.
- **Parking isn't included in this package.** Parking is \$5 a vehicle and gets you a free souvenir program.
- **No vehicles are permitted on the camp-site area,** located around the pond area behind the stadium. This is for tents and participants *only*. Vehicles must be parked in the parking lot on the Hwy 39 side of the ballpark and unloaded from there. Anyone not abiding by guidelines will be asked to leave with no refunds. **PLEASE no driving on the grass!**
- Port-a-Potties will be provided at the campsite area. Stadium bathrooms will not be available before 6:15 p.m. or after the stadium closes following the movie.
- Entrance into the ballpark will not be allowed until 6:15 p.m.
- The Mudcats are not responsible for lost or stolen items from the camp-site area. Please do not leave valuables unattended while you are away from your site.
- Upon check-in, you will receive a packet, containing Food Coupon, Ice Cream Coupon, Game Ticket, and Sportsmanship Patch. The number of coupons/tickets will be the number you registered and paid for.
- In the event of a rain-out (*complete* rain-out, meaning that we do not play the game), the rain-date will be Friday, May 25th. If the game is played, the campout will go on as planned. No refunds will be given in the event that the game is played.
- Mudcats staff will be on-site all night. In the event of storms or bad weather, you will be informed. It is each individual troop's decision whether to pack up or to wait out the storms. Apply the Health and Safety requirements of the BSA programs.

Apply the Rules and Regulations of the BSA as they apply to outdoor activities.

Identify local resources and consultants for high adventure activities.

This course is not a total training program that enables the leader to be an expert or even self sufficient in and aspect of outdoor skills. The leader will still need knowledgeable, trained and certified individuals (consultants) to help provide a safe and active outdoor/ high- adventure program.

Florida Sea Base Lottery Registration Set to Open

The registration period for

The lottery for 2013 high adventures at the Florida National High Adventure Sea Base opens January 15. Below are key points to remember as you register:

- The registration period is from January 15 to February 15.
- Access to the Sea Base lottery is obtained through the Sea Base website, www.bsaseabase.org.
- A Scout unit leader must create an account to access the reservation site. If the unit already has an account, another one can't be created. [Contact Sea Base](#) for additional information if you can't access your account.
- A unit can request any number of dates and adventures that interest its Scouts.
- Requests can be prioritized to increase the chances that the unit gets one of its top choices.
- Requests can be added, deleted, or reprioritized during the lottery period.
- Multiple crews can be requested for a specific date and adventure.
- When a date and adventure are awarded to a unit, the unit gets all the crews requested. HOWEVER, units can't mix and match different adventures on the same date.
- Units will be notified of the lottery results by March 1.
- Units have 30 days to send a \$100-per-person deposit to confirm reservations.
- All remaining vacancies will be made available on the reservation site on a first-come, first-served basis.
- All adventure materials will be mailed in the fall after the first-half payment is received.
- Individuals and small groups may attend Sea Base using Scout Connections on the website.
